



## LIBRARY EXPANDS TELESCOPE LENDING PROGRAM

Last year most area libraries, in cooperation with the St. Louis Astronomical Society (SLAS), began offering telescopes for patrons to check out. The people from SLAS purchase the Orion StarBlast 4.5 telescopes and retrofit them to make them safer and more convenient for casual users. They also offer 'star parties' to libraries, where they visit on an evening, offer an orientation in telescope use, and then take everyone outside for viewing objects in the night sky. We have had two star parties so far, and we hope to have more in the future.

The program has been so popular that we are expanding it. Later this summer we will get a second telescope, so more library users can have a chance at taking one home. Thanks to the Friends of the Library, who have agreed to purchase the new telescope. To request the telescope, just look up 'telescope' as a title in the catalog.
