#### HISTORY OF WEBSTER GROVES PARKS

For the third year in a row, we will have a local history display in our gallery during the month of July. This year's display will feature the history of our local parks.

We worked with the Parks Department and City Hall to locate archival photos, and combed through decades of newspapers, newsletters, local history books and other sources to compile a history of the 19 named parks in Webster Groves.

From the earliest parks, like Larson, Ruhe, and the Plant Nature Preserve, to the postwar creation of Memorial Park and Blackburn Park, to the two great expansions of our park system in the 1960s and 1970s, there is a story to tell about almost every park in town.

As always, the display will premier during the Community Days Parade the morning of the 4th of July, and will remain up for the whole month.

### FRIENDS ANNUAL MEETING JUNE 23rd



The Friends of Webster Groves Public Library will hold their annual meeting on Friday, June 23rd from 5 to 6:30 p.m. All members of the Friends are invited to attend, to get to know other Friends and enjoy good company, food,

and drink. As usual, the business portion of the meeting—which includes election of officers for the upcoming year—will be kept short. The event will be held outdoors, and there will be a dedication of the Library's new Reading Garden area, which the Friends helped to finance.

In 2014 the Library was contacted by Eric and Hallie Bronner, Webster Groves residents who help to administer the Dr. Bronner's Family Foundation. They wanted to donate a portion of the Foundation's annual charitable funds to improve the landscaping around the Library. That landscaping has been installed in three successive phases over the past few years. The Bronner Foundation money paid for part of it, but that money was augmented by large infusions of cash from the Friends of the Library.

The foundation plantings around the building, the Reading Garden at the southeast corner of the building, and the flagpole area are all new, and enhance the overall look of our Library.

The Friends are also starting a program to allow Library patrons to buy pavers in the new landscaped areas and have them engraved as memorials to loved ones. To discuss buying a memorial paver, e-mail *friends@wgpl.org*.
