SUPER MOON? BLUE MOON? YIKES!

As I am writing this, we are getting close to January's second full moon. People are saying that it is a 'super moon,' and a 'blue moon,' but there are conflicting interpretations on that. On NASA's Facebook page, they are declaring a 'Super Blue Blood Moon.' Each is defined by astronomical phenomena.

A super moon is a full moon that occurs at the same time as perigee, or the closest the moon ever gets to the earth. This month's moon, while close, is not actually the closest. *The Farmer's Almanac* is urging us not to water down the term by declaring every close full moon a 'super moon.' I'll let NASA and the folks at *The Farmer's Almanac* argue that out.

This full moon is also a blue moon. What does that mean? Again, conflicting information. NASA will tell you that a blue moon is the third full moon in any season that has four full moons—and that only happens once

every two and a half years. But in popular terms, we have started to call the second full moon in a given month a blue moon. In order for there to be four full moons in one season, there has to be a second full moon in a month: but according to NASA, that's not the actual definition.

Years ago, such questions were what reference librarians spent their time answering for people. Nowadays we lament the fact that everyone gets their information online, only rarely asking us questions. But realistically, the answer you might find in one source can be invalidated by another source, this whole super moon/blue moon conundrum being just one example. I like that we can now easily investigate many sources.

This full moon is also, due a pending lunar eclipse, a blood moon. I say we just enjoy the show and not split hairs.

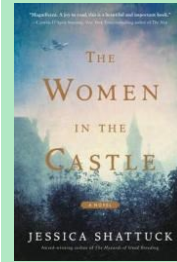

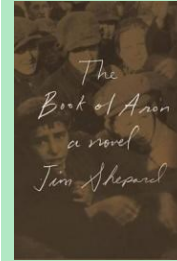

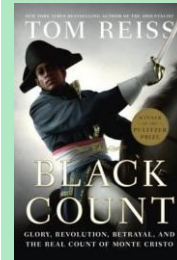

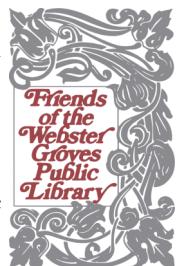


First-place winner (ages 10 – 13) Addison Davis with her winning entry.
