Annual Report
Webster Groves Public Library
July 1, 2024—June 30, 2025

Another year has come and gone at the Webster Groves Public Library. It is heartening to see how deeply the community continues to rely on and enjoy our services, resources, and programs. Regular visits, strong program attendance, and enthusiastic use of digital resources all demonstrate that the Library remains an essential part of daily life in Webster Groves.

Circulation has remained steady overall, with a continued uptick in OverDrive and Hoopla check-outs as more patrons embrace digital reading and streaming options.

This past year also marked a major milestone in our technical services. On October 17, 2024, we migrated to the new Missouri Evergreen Integrated Library System (ILS). This transition required months of data clean-up and preparation to ensure accurate migration of patron records and item information. Staff dedicated substantial time to training and updating internal workflows, while also assisting patrons as they adapted to the new catalog interface and account features. After a transition period, both staff and patrons have now settled comfortably into Missouri Evergreen. The benefits are already clear—a more cost-efficient ILS and access to a much larger consortium catalog, giving our patrons a wider range of materials and strengthening our daily operations.

Programming at the Library has continued to grow in both content and diversity. New educational and arts programs, expanded youth activities, and a variety of workshops and lifelong-learning opportunities have helped us better meet the needs of our community. Attendance has remained strong, and feedback has been overwhelmingly positive. We were also fortunate to strengthen community partnerships this year, working closely with organizations such as Webster Arts, Epworth, and Webster-Rock Hill Ministries to enrich our offerings and broaden our reach.

On the building front, we continued to face challenges with the HVAC system throughout the year, requiring frequent attention to maintain a comfortable environment. Ongoing issues with the roof also persist and will eventually require significant repair or replacement. Despite these concerns, the Library has remained fully open and committed to providing uninterrupted service. At the same time, we made several positive improvements to enhance the patron experience. New furniture and reconfigured layouts in both the reference area and the children's room have made these spaces more welcoming, functional, and better aligned with the needs of our community.

Passport services remain busy, the Art Gallery continues to bring beautiful and thought-provoking exhibits to our space, and patrons of all ages enjoy the wide range of resources and amenities we offer. Our meeting room has also been in regular use by local organizations, civic groups, and community members, highlighting the Library's role as a central hub for collaboration, learning, and connection.

Looking ahead, the Webster Groves Public Library will continue expanding our programming, strengthening community partnerships, and growing our collection and services. We remain committed to meeting the evolving needs of the Webster Groves community and to keeping the Library a vibrant, responsive, and inclusive institution for all.

The coming year holds many opportunities, and I am excited for what lies ahead.







CIRCULATION BY COLLECTION, JULY 2024 – JUNE 2025




Circulation by Type
