In April we ran a film series in our Meeting Room. For four Friday nights at 7 p.m. we had free movies for families. Since it was April we called it our *April Fools Film Series* and screened four old comedies, from the Marx Brothers to Jimmy Stewart in *Harvey*.

Only one dedicated soul showed up to see the first movie, but after that we saw pretty good groups of people come in to enjoy our movies. We had popcorn and sodas and there was a real going-to-themovies feel about it (albeit free . . . )

So we're planning to do it again. We had hoped to do our next film series in early to mid-summer, but then we realized that would conflict with the Old Orchard Gazebo series, a mainstay of Webster Groves life, which takes place mostly through June and July.

So now we're thinking about doing it in late summer, maybe August. We have

considered what kind of series we would do next. The comedy films were popular, but we don't want to always do old comedies.

We have been considering doing beach movies, like *Beach Blanket Bingo*, *Gidget*, and Elvis's *Blue Hawaii*. Those might bring in a sentimental crowd. But we are open to other ideas.

Maybe you have an idea for what would make a fun and popular film series for the Library. Let us know! Remember, one of our requirements is that they be reasonably family-friendly, because everyone is invited. Whatever we decide to do next time, we hope you'll come.

We can show the movies in public because we have a movie license that our Friends group pays for, covering most major studios. We want to thank them for making this program possible.


