#### **REOPENING**

On July 29, St. Louis County Library returned all of its locations to curbside-only service, with no public access to its buildings. This was in response to continually increasing numbers of new COVID-19 infections in the county. In rapid succession, most of the MLC libraries followed suit. As Webster Groves Public Library was preparing to return to curbside-only service, we received the news that a staff member was possibly exposed to the virus, and we had to shut down completely pending test results. As of this writing, we do not yet know whether our employee tested positive or negative.

Our plan is to reopen Monday, August 10, offering curbside service to pick up requested items. We will offer a blend of appointments and drive-ups. If you call in advance, we can have your items checked out and waiting to hand to you when you arrive. If you drive up, pull into a designated spot, call us at 314.961.3784, give your name, and a library clerk will retrieve and check out your items, and bring them to you. In either situation, you must have your library card number handy. We ask that you open a trunk or hatch or back car window, so we can put your library materials into your car with minimal contact.

We have no idea how long this reduced service will continue. If you need any help requesting items from our catalog, please call us and someone will assist you.
