REOPENING: PHASE 2

On Tuesday, September 8, we will once again reopen to allow people into the building for limited service. You may come in to browse for books and movies and check them out. But chairs have been removed from the tables, there are no newspapers out, and several of our auxiliary services, such as passport acceptance and test proctoring, are not available.

We will be doing conversion of VHS tapes. It will just take longer, because we will quarantine any tapes you bring in for four days before beginning the conversion process. Call the Reference Department at 314.961.7277 if you have any questions.

We will also have computers available for half-hour appointments. You do not need to reserve in advance.

We will continue curbside service for those who would rather not enter the building. You may make an appointment to pick up requested items, or just pull into one of our designated spaces and call 314.961.3784.

There are a few important rules to be aware of:

- Face masks are required to enter.
- Maintain social distance of 6'
- No unattended children in the building

Other rules apply, and are posted throughout the building. We hope to continue moving forward in providing library service to the Webster Groves community, and we thank you for your patience and understanding as we find new ways of doing business in these challenging times.
