DOWNLOADABLES REFRESHER

During COVID, our various downloadable services have been used more than ever. And yet it appears that there are still plenty of Library users who are unfamiliar with what we offer. Here is a quick guide.

OverDrive: Our first eBook and audiobook service. You download an app called Libby and then use it to request current books in either e-book or audiobook format. You can



read or listen to phone,

or computer. These are single-use books, meaning only one reader at a time can have a copy checked out, so there are waiting lists for popular items on OverDrive.

OverDrive now also holds all of the magazines we once offered through our RBDigital magazine service. Check out copies of your favorite magazines and keep them! No need to return these items.

Hoopla: Another popular service offering ebooks, audiobooks, comic books, TV shows, music, and movies. It is easy to add the

Hoopla app to your device, search and



check out content. The content is not as current as on OverDrive, but there are thousands of titles and multiple readers can check out the same title at the same time-meaning no waiting lists. There is a 12 item per month limit on your library card.

Because the Library does pay for each item checked out on Hoopla, reciprocity privileges do not apply-meaning only Webster Groves residents may use our Hoopla service.

Kanopy: A downloadable movie service, Kanopy features independent films, and archived films such as the Criterion Collection. Download and watch Kanopy movies on a computer, tablet, or even your televi-

sion. There is a limit of 3 movies per month on your library card.

FISHING, ANYONE?

Webster Groves Public Library, in cooperation with the Missouri Department of Conservation, will soon offer fishing poles for checkout. This is ideal for anyone-adult or child-who has wanted to try fishing but does not want to spend all the money to acquire the equipment.

Each fishing pole comes complete with hook, weight, and bobber. We also offer a list of free places in the area where you can go to try fishing. The equipment checks out for three weeks, so you have time to take it out more than once. We will allow any adult patron to check out two fishing poles at a

time, to make it easier for a family to enjoy an outing. We hope to have the poles ready soon. Check for 'fishing poles' in the Library's catalog.

Since some safety precautions do apply, the fishing poles will only be checked out to adults.

QUARANTINETIMES FOR LIBRARY MATERIALS

During the coronavirus pandemic, libraries have faced a problem that stores and restaurants do not face—everything that people take home from here is eventually coming back here. In response to this, every library has quarantined returned library materials, meaning that returned items are set aside for a matter of days before being checked in and shelved. These times have ranged from four days to as much as a week. This is another reason why our public meeting room will not be open any time soon—all of those quarantined materials are piled on tables in there.

Our quarantine times were set in response to studies that showed how long the virus can live on hardcover and softcover books, or CD and DVD cases. But later opinions from experts doubted some of these studies, saying that the amount of virus sprayed on the tested objects was excessive and unrealistic. In coordination with the other MLC libraries, we recently cut our quarantine time in half, to 48 hours.

We hope this alleviates some of the concern of Library users who have returned items only to see them still on their cards four days later, though the 2-day quarantine time will still be practiced for the foreseeable future.
