WEBSTER GROVES COVID HISTORY ARCHIVE

For several years one of the missions of Webster Groves Public Library has been to serve as a repository for our city's history. Cooperation with City Hall, with the Historic Preservation Commission, and with the Webster Groves Historical Society has been key in this. We have made significant strides in making much of our local history more accessible to interested readers.

As we gradually crawl out from under the influence of the COVID-19 pandemic, it occurs to us that we should not lose the opportunity to gather some first-hand history about this important moment in our city's history. We are putting out this call to individuals, families, businesses, churches, organizations and clubs: if you have an interesting story to tell, if you want to share something unique or inspiring that happened to you, some way you found of coping, we want to hear about it.

Write up your story, your memory, your thoughts in a few pages (please don't overwhelm us with an entire manuscript!) and bring it in. Or e-mail <u>tcooper@wgpl.org</u>. If you send an e-mail, make the subject heading COVID History Archive. We will print out and file everything we receive. Send photos if you have them, and they will be added to the archive.

Do not send anything you don't want openly shared. The archive will be available to anyone who wants to look through it. If you would like to share a story but would rather not have your name used or your family identified, please note that in your submission.

We will augment the archive by adding local news stories about the City's pandemic response.

We hope this will help people in years to come in understanding what happened during this time, how families were impacted, how individuals got along, and ways businesses found to remain in business despite necessary restrictions on their activities.


FRIENDS OF THE LIBRARY ADULT SCAVENGER HUNT
