The display includes a recent portrait by photographer Cathy Lander-Goldberg as well as a copy of a past photo provided by each participant.


This display will be available June 2 – 30.

## **CHANGES IN LIBRARY CARDS FOR JUVENILE CARDHOLDERS**

In order to comply with <u>Missouri Regulation 15 CSR 30-200.015</u> and receive state funding for the Library there will be an update to our juvenile library card procedures in July. This update will lead to all juvenile cards expiring by July 31. These expired cards will need to be updated by parents or guardians before the card can be used again. Parents and guardians will have to come into the Library and sign off on a new form for the card renewal to take place. Newly issued juvenile cards will also require parents or guardians to sign off on the same form.
