## **UPDATING JUVENILE LIBRARY CARDS**

In order to comply with <u>Missouri Regulation 15 CSR 30-200.015</u> and receive state funding for the Library, the Library will be asking all parents and guardians to update their children's library cards. To update these accounts, parents and guardians will need to come into the Library and sign off on a new form acknowledging that they are responsible for the materials their children check out on juvenile cards. This form will also be required for any new juvenile library cards. As of July 31, any card that has not yet been updated has expired. Expired cards will need to be updated before the card can be used again.
