

WISH TREES AT THE LIBRARY

The Library currently has two Wish Trees up in our building. One on our main floor and another on our top floor outside the Children's Room. These trees have ornaments on them that you can take to fulfill wishes and support two of our community partners, Dogs for Our Brave and Youth in Need.

Dogs for Our Brave provides professionally trained service dogs, at no cost, to veterans who have suffered debilitating injury or illness while in service to our country. As part of their training and socialization, the dogs visit our library regularly and children are given the opportunity to practice their reading skills with the dogs as a non-judgmental reading buddy.

Youth in Need is our Safe Place partner. Safe Place is a national youth outreach and prevention program for young people under the age of 24 in need of immediate help and

safety. Youth in Need is our licensed agency responsible for assisting the Library's Safe Place site with signage and training and is the professional contact for youth who request help at our site.

Each ornament on the trees will represent an item the organizations have on their Amazon Gift Wish Lists. Patrons can choose an ornament, follow the QR code link to Amazon with a cell phone camera and purchase the gift online.

sources, and their passion for art.


This exhibit celebrates their support for each other as both artists and friends.
