On October 21 our Reference Librarian, John Egel, spoke at the Monday Club about the interesting stories he found while working for over 3 years on digitizing the Kate Moody Collection. A nice group was present and we very much appreciate the club allowing John to share his experience with the collection. The project was completed in July and a <u>link to the collection</u> is found on our website.

The Webster Groves Rotary Club, through a grant made in conjunction with the national organization, recently donated \$2,000 to



the Library to purchase a new overhead document scanner for the Reference Department and 6 Yoto audiobook players and accessories for our children's library. The scanner can capture images as large as an open newspaper or as small as a business card.

The Yoto players will be available for checkout in the new year. A kit will include the player, a charger and audiobook cards. Save the date for our annual meeting Sunday December 2. More information to come.


