

NewsBank Resources

This year, the Friends funded two additions to the Library's NewsBank collection, a popular online reference resource. The Life in America series documents the experiences of the Asian, Black, and Hispanic communities from the 1700s through current day as reported in news media and historical sources. America's News provides access to over 3,000 publications across the U.S. covering topics such as health, business, education, and political and social issues. NewsBank is accessible from anywhere by using your library card number.



Reference Area Furniture

At the request of Library staff, the reference area in the lower level got a new look with the Friends' purchase of three new round tables which provide built-in power outlets. They have proven popular with library patrons who appreciate their size and functionality.
