

DIRECTOR'S CORNER

On March 14, 2025, President Trump signed an executive order to eliminate the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS), which is the federal agency tasked with distributing congressionally appropriated funds to state libraries, which in turn are used to help fund statewide initiatives and subgrants to libraries.

For WGPL and libraries throughout the state, IMLS money funds a statewide courier system that allows libraries to share items amongst each other to maximize what is available to all Missouri library users.

The funds also provide funding for an integrated library system consortium (Missouri Evergreen) which allows 70+ libraries throughout Missouri to share a card catalog system which further strengthens this idea of resource sharing amongst libraries. IMLS funding enabled WGPL and the rest of the Municipal Library Consortium of STL to migrate to the Missouri Evergreen Consorti-

um in October of 2024.

IMLS funds have also been used to provide access to staff training opportunities, Wolfner Talking Book and Braille Library, and, for WGPL, it has enabled us to apply for grants that have helped us to keep our technology up to date for both staff and patrons, to provide special programming for the community, to help fund the yearly Summer Reading Program, and more.

While an elimination of this agency would have financial repercussions on WGPL and an overall negative impact on our Library, the negative impact for Missouri's rural and smaller libraries could be absolutely devastating and would put library services for the communities that need them most in jeopardy


