AN ANNIVERSARY YEAR

In 2026 we have something to celebrate. 75 years ago on November 5, 1951, the Webster Groves Public Library building at 301 E. Lockwood Ave. opened its doors. To commemorate this milestone, throughout the year we will have various displays, events, and further historical tidbits in this newsletter, all building up to a birthday party in November. Everyone is invited.

This anniversary also provides a good occasion to celebrate the even deeper roots the Library has in our community. Our 75-year-old building is in truth the Library's fifth location, as we can trace our lineage in an unbroken line to a public library and reading

room started in 1884 in a somewhat ramshackle building located on the dusty corner of Lockwood and Church (now N. Gore) Avenues. In between we've been housed at the 1st Congregational Church (1893 – 1911), the Monday Club (1911 – 1928), and the high school (1928 – 1951). We will be sharing more about that fuller history as well in the coming weeks and months.

We hope you enjoy what we have planned for our Diamond Jubilee this year because it's as much your celebration as it is ours.


